




Q2 Before you started coming to this congregation, were you participating in another church?





Q3 2. How long does it usually take you to travel from home to church?





Q4 3. On the average, about how many times have you "attended" church worship (in-person or virtually) during the past year?






Q6 5. Has your involvement in the congregation increased, decreased, or remained about the same in the last few years?





Q8 If your participation has DECREASED, which of the following are reasons for that? (check all that apply):





Q9 6. Approximately how much does your family household contribute to our church per year? (If single or widowed, you as an individual?)





Q10 7. How many persons or families have you invited to visit or join the church in the past year?






Q11 8. How many of your closest friends attend this church?









Q29 Which best describes your current household?





Q31 How many years have you lived in this general area?






